Members' Recital, Saturday 1st April, 3pm, St Peter's Cathedral, Belfast

This year's **Members' Recital** will take place in the newly opened St Peter's Cathedral, following extensive restoration of the organ by Kenneth Jones Organ in 2005. We are delighted to welcome not only three marvelous organists, but the Senior Choir of the **Sacred Heart Grammar School, Newry**, and their Head of Music and Musical Director, Dr Damian Frame. Our three organists are **Liam Crangle**, a chorister at Armagh Church of Ireland Cathedral and a student of Professor Gerard Gillen, **Adam Walker**, Organ Scholar at Fisherwick Presbyterian Church and a student of Neale Agnew, and the Belfast City Organist, **Colm Carey**.

St Peter's Cathedral have added what can only be described as a truly remarkable instrument to the Belfast organ scene, and this instrument can be heard (and felt!) through a vast array of colours and textures – worth seeing and hearing! Only completed in the last six months, be amongst the first to hear this exciting new sound!

St Peter's Cathedral is the twin-spired building that can be seen from the Westlink. Turn off the Westlink at Divis Street (heading north), take the third left into Albert Street, and turn left into St Peter's Close. Secure Parking is available to the left hand side of the Cathedral, through the gates: please use it.

As usual, we look forward to welcome all members and those interested in joining the society. *Be assured, this is not an April Fool, it being the 1st !!*

CD Reviews

Hyperion Records have had a great couple of months, releasing wonderful CDs by Westminster Abbey Choir (including former Belfast Cathedral Chorister, David Martin) and Polyphony. Westminster Abbey have recorded The Great Service by William Byrd in its entirety, and Music for Trinity Sunday including Howells' Evening Canticles for the Abbey, and Stainer's *I saw the Lord*. Robert Quinney, the Abbey's Assistant plays Stanford's Fantasia and Toccata in D minor, op.57: what a piece! Polyphony, under the direction of Stephen Layton has recorded the works of two American composers, Morten Lauridsen and Eric Whitacre. These two composers certainly know how to write passionate and awe inspiring music, and the London based choir Polyphony certainly know how to sing it, perhaps unlike American choirs!
