Organ Recital by Gordon Stewart in St. Anne's at 7:30 p.m.

The Cathedral is on Donegall St. (an extension of Clifton St.) about 0.4 miles (600m) from the Clifton St. exit of the Westlink (follow the signs for City Centre). From the A2/M3 Bangor direction, leave the new M3 bridge just after crossing the river, turn left into Nelson Street at the lights, right into Dunbar Link at next lights, left into York Street at next lights, and left into Donegall Street at the lights.

GORDON STEWART

Gordon Stewart is one of Britain's busiest organists. Throughout Europe and in America, South Africa and New Zealand, he has delighted audiences with programmes ranging from the earliest known organ music through the baroque to the virtuosic 19th and 20th century repertoire. He was born in Dundee and studied at the Royal Manchester College of Music and at the Geneva Conservatoire, gaining a performer's diploma with distinction from the former and a premier prix de virtuosité from the latter. His teachers included Gillian Weir, Lionel Rogg and Eric Chadwick.



A former organist of Blackburn and Manchester Cathedrals, he has been for 15 years organist of Huddersfield Town Hall (Kirklees Borough Organist) with its magnificent Father Willis organ.

In addition to organ playing, Gordon is one of the regular conductors on BBC's Songs of Praise and has worked on programmes throughout England and in South Africa and Athens. He spent three years as Musical Director of the Millennium Youth Choir. He is a past President of the IAO and has been awarded Fellowships of both the RSCM and the RCO.

The Royal School of Church Music is an educational charity committed to enabling the best use of music in worship, church life, and the wider community. It is an open, life-long



learning organization, offering direct and indirect education and training through its programmes, published resources, courses, and activities. With more than 8,500 affiliates, members and friends in over 40 countries it is an international network, encouraged by over 750 volunteers, and supported by a small staff based in the UK.

Founded by Sir Sydney Nicholson in 1927, its original emphases were English and choral music. Now, in a diverse international context, the RSCM's work is far broader and more diverse. It offers models of good practice, provides programmes and resources that can be adapted to local circumstances, and supports the work of local churches through its voluntary committees.

The RSCM affirms the continuation of the great tradition of choral church music in cathedrals, parish churches, chapels and schools, and seeks to enable each worshipping community to discover good music appropriate to its needs. It aims for high standards in all it does, from the simplest singing or playing in a small church or community to the most advanced choral activity.

This month's brainteaser concerns that not too well known but much loved trivial composer, I. M. A. Nobody, who was thinking of writing a tribute Prelude and Fugue to one of his favourite church composers. He coded their surnames using the standard convention, shown in bar 1 as the well known musical equivalent of BACH (used by many e.g. Liszt and Reger) and of course bar 2 shows Duruflé's famous cipher of ALAIN's name which is simply an extension of the BACH representation, where the ABCDEFGH "real note sequence" is simply repeated to cover the entire alphabet. Each bar represents one composer's surname, but the poor guy must have had no inspiration at all. The competition is

to work out the ten composers' surnames represented by bars 3 - 12 below. This month's prize will be donated by Alistair McCartney, who runs POPCo, the Pipe Organ Preservation Company, as well as the USOC website.

AUDIO ARCHIVE

Alistair McCartney is compiling an audio archive of organs past and present in Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland.

So far he has collected several hundred hours of material ranging from the 1950s to the present day. This represents just under one hundred organs and includes instruments which have long since disappeared. These not only consist of solo performances but also include the organ in the context of choir accompaniment and broadcast services.
