




#### VISIT TO PORTADOWN

- First Portadown Presbyterian 2 manual, 23 stop Conacher (1909), substantially rebuilt 2003 Wells Kennedy.
- Thomas St. Methodist 2 manual, 18 stop Robson (c. 1800), rebuilt 1860 Conacher, 1985 Wells Kennedy.




An event to celebrate the centenary of Olivier Messiaen's birth (10th December, 1908), presented by Colm Carey in conjunction with Belfast City Council.

## ORGAN SCHOLARSHIP 2008~2009

Fisherwick Church is seeking to appoint a new Organ Scholar from 1st September 2008. The scheme, which has been running very successfully since 1999, places a strong emphasis on organ playing and choral direction. Past organ scholars have found this opportunity to be a valuable step in their musical careers and the last two have been offered Organ scholarships at Oxford Colleges.

Under the terms of the scholarship, organ scholars will receive:

- A bursary of £1000 per annum, paid monthly.
- Free weekly organ lessons from the Director of Music.
- Juse of the Fisherwick Organ for practice.
- Experience of the management and training of a choir and the programming of music for the liturgical year.

The scholarship is awarded for one academic year, but may be renewed annually.

#### AUDIO ARCHIVE

Alistair McCartney is compiling an audio archive of organs past and present in Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland.

So far he has collected several hundred hours of material ranging from the 1950s to the present day. This represents just under one hundred organs and includes instruments which have long since disappeared. These not only consist of solo performances but also include the organ in the context of choir accompaniment and broadcast services.
